From August 5-9, Raleigh, NC served as the host city to hundreds of BDPA members, nonmembers, students, and supporters, there to participate in the 2009 National BDPA conference, which was held at the Raleigh Convention Center. The 31st annual conference provided attendees opportunities to network, participate in workshops focusing on professional development and expanding knowledge within different IT areas, and explore career opportunities with various companies at the Career Expo (go to page 4 for photos).

The conference was kicked off by an opening ceremony featuring Master of Ceremony Mario Armstrong, XM Radio and TV Technology Talk Show Host, who definitely kept the crowd entertained, and kevnote speaker Lamman Rucker, the actor most known for his starring roles in Tyler Perry's Meet the Browns sitcom and hit movie, Why Did I Get Married?. Mr. Rucker. who almost did not make the opening ceremony due to a tire blowout on the way to Raleigh, drew upon his own IT experience and offered words of encouragement and inspiration to the audience.

The technology workshops focused on such topics as leadership, professional development, project management, technical subjects, and IT entrepreneurship. Some of the workshops held included Corporate Etiquette and International Protocol, LinkedIn– Networking for the 21st Century, Web Design Done Right, Green IT: Virtualization, Top 10 Security Threats and Preventions for 2009, and IT Services: Thinking and Understanding the Service Management Alphabet Soup.

Social Marketing Strategies: July Program Meeting Summary



Due to rapidly-rising popularity of social networks, on Thursday, July 16, BDPA-NY held a program meeting to discuss "Social Marketing Strategies". Roget Romain, a web savvy media mogul

and the program meeting presenter, provided insightful guidelines for increasing web presence.

Roget discussed the use of "Search Engine" optimization (SEO) for increasing the volume and quality of traffic to a web site. SEO refers to making changes to a website so that it can attain higher search engine positions for specific key phrases in search results. Roget advises that before proceeding with optimizing your web pages with keywords; identify relevant keywords. "Make a list of potential keywords by talking with employees, customers, family and friends. Finalize the list with keyword popularity tools such as Wordtracker and Google AdWord's Keyword tool, and then try searching under those terms. Take notes on how many similar sites are found, and for which competitors. Add the keywords to the URL, and to the following HTML tags: Title, Meta(Keywords, Descriptions, etc.), Header, Body, Link, and Image (alt attribute)."

ing enhancements: Back link website URL to popular social networks, Register each website page versus one registration for entire site, and Purchase misspelled domains and back link them to the 'correct' domain name. As an added bonus, Roget provided the following Tips and Tricks for increasing web presence:

- Blog daily but don't overdo it.
- Post daily to at least one of the top four social networks: Facebook, Linkedin, Myspace, Twitter
- Ning.com is Roget's favorite social network; information can be extracted & for \$30 the brand name will not appear
- ✓ If you upload videos to Youtube.com, watermark everything
- Post articles with a human interest theme to boost interest. The following sites allow posting; craigslist.org, digg.com, ezinearticles.com, articlealley.com
- ✓ Use short URLs. TinyURL.com will convert your long URL to a shorter one
