In March 2010, census forms will be delivered to every residence in the United States and Puerto Rico. The U.S. Census, required by the Constitu-

tion to take place every 10 years, counts

every resident in the United States, and is important in helping communities receive federal funding for things like hospitals, schools, and job training centers. For complete info on the 2010 Census visit 2010.census.gov.
